

CORE VALUES

1. _____-Focused

The Word of God is our ultimate authority. Mature followers of Jesus Christ must know God's Word and how to read, interpret, and teach Scripture. WEST DIGHTON CHRISTIAN CHURCH prioritizes clear Biblical teaching and emphasizes the great sense of urgency for the church to know Scripture and understand the truths of the Bible. The time one is in the Scriptures directly impacts their relationship with God and the ability to obey His commands.

2. _____Dependent

God's vision for WEST DIGHTON CHRISTIAN CHURCH will be fulfilled only if we remain on our knees, recognizing that apart from the work of God and the empowering of the Holy Spirit, nothing of lasting value will happen. We can only accomplish much only by relying on God's power and not our own.

3. _____-Centered

The centrality of all we do revolves around the gospel message. The gospel is the message that we have been commissioned to share with anyone who hears. As Paul clearly states in Romans 1:16 ...[the gospel] *is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes...*

STATEMENT OF FAITH

WHAT WE BELIEVE

- **The Word of God** We believe that God has revealed Himself through the Bible. We believe the Bible, consisting of the Old and New Testaments, to be the only Inspired, Inerrant, Infallible, and Authoritative Word of God.
- **God** We believe in One God, infinite in Wisdom, Goodness, and Love. We believe that He is eternally existent in three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- **Jesus** We believe that Jesus Christ is the only-begotten Son of God. We believe that for us and our salvation He took on human form, that He was born of a virgin, that He lived a sinless life, that He performed miracles, that He died on the cross for our sins, that on the third day He was bodily resurrected, and that He ascended to the right hand of God the Father. We believe in His second coming in power and glory.
- **Salvation** We believe that for the salvation of lost and sinful mankind, regeneration by the Holy Spirit is essential.
- **The Holy Spirit** We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit. He takes the things of Christ and reveals them to us, renewing, comforting and inspiring our souls. We believe that only by His indwelling power and fullness are Christians enabled to live a godly life in this present sinful world.

- **Last Things** We believe that Jesus Christ will raise up all the dead, give eternal life and everlasting joy to believers, and condemn unbelievers to eternal punishment.
- **The Church** We believe that the unity of the Church can only be brought about by a common faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.



As we place ourselves under the influence of the Bible, Holy Spirit and other Christ-followers or lives can be transformed as we apply the things we learn to our lives.


This transformation affects our character, behavior, and relationships. A changed life results in partnering with God in his mission to reach the world.


THE BIBLE CALLS THIS ATTITUDE:_____.

I accept your gift of salvation. Please help me to grow now as a Christian."

II. WHAT IS THE MEANING OF BAPTISM?

1. It _____ CHRIST'S BURIAL AND RESURRECTION

"Christ died for our sins... He was buried...and He rose again." 1 Cor. 15:3-4

"For when you are baptized, you were buried with Christ, and in baptism you were also raised with Christ. Col. 2:12

2. IT ILLUSTRATES MY _____ AS A CHRISTIAN.

"When someone becomes a Christian he becomes a brand new person inside. The old life has passed away and a new life has begun!" 2 Cor. 5:17

"By our baptism then, we were buried with Him and shared His death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead...so also we may live a new life!" Rom. 6:4



TO REPEAT: Baptism doesn't make you a believer — it shows that **you already believe**. Baptism does not “save” you, only your faith in Christ does that. Baptism is like a wedding ring — it's the outward symbol of the commitment

you made in your heart.

“For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith...it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast.”

III. WHY BE BAPTIZED BY IMMERSION?

1. BECAUSE _____ WAS BAPTIZED THAT WAY.

“As soon as Jesus was baptized, He went up out of the water.” Matthew 3:16

2. EVERY BAPTISM IN THE _____ WAS BY IMMERSION.

“...then both Philip and the man went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water...” Acts 8:38-39

3. THE WORD “BAPTIZE” MEANS TO _____ WATER”.

The Greek word *baptizo* means “to immerse or dip under water”.

4. IT BEST _____ A BURIAL AND RESURRECTION!

The founders of various denominations agree:

Martin Luther ...“I would have those who are to be baptized to be entirely immersed, as the word imports and the mystery signifies.”

John Calvin...“The word ‘baptize’ signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the ancient church.”

John Wesley...“Buried with Him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the custom of the first church.”

IV. WHO SHOULD BE BAPTIZED?

EVERY PERSON WHO HAS _____ IN CHRIST.

“Those who believed and accepted His message were baptized...” Acts 2:41

“Simon himself believed and was baptized...” Acts 8:13

“But when they believed Philip as he preached the Good News...and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women.” Acts 8:12

At WEST DIGHTON CHRISTIAN CHURCH, we wait until our children are old enough to **believe** and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them.

Some churches practice a “*baptism of confirmation*” for children. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on the behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his own personal confession of Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed. **This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible** which was only for those old enough to believe. The purpose is to publicly confess your personal commitment to Christ.

At WEST DIGHTON CHRISTIAN CHURCH, it is a membership requirement that every member must have been baptized the way Jesus demonstrated, even though some of us were “confirmed” as children.

V. WHEN SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

AS SOON AS YOU HAVE BELIEVED!

“Those who believed...were baptized...that day!” Acts 2:41

“Then Philip began with the scripture and told him the Good News about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water, and the man said, ‘Look, here is water! Why shouldn’t I be baptized right now?’ Philip said, ‘If you believe with all your heart, you may.’ The man answered, ‘I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.’ So they went down into the water and Philip baptized him.” Acts 8:35-38

There is no reason to delay. As soon as you have decided to receive Christ into your life, you can and should be baptized.

If you wait until you are “perfect”, you’ll never feel “good enough”!

CAN MY FAMILY BE BAPTIZED TOGETHER?

Yes! If each family member understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed his/her trust in Christ for salvation.

However, it is important to remember that baptism is a *personal* statement of faith, not a family tradition. It is usually not wise to delay your baptism while waiting on other family members to accept Christ, particularly children. This puts an undue pressure on them, and delays *your* obedience.

WILL I HAVE TO SAY ANYTHING?

No. You don’t have to but it is strongly suggested. Later you will be given a certificate of your baptism. We try to take your picture and place it on your certificate.. This is to help you remember your baptism.

THE LORD'S SUPPER



THE MEANING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth. But He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called “ordinances”) as reminders of His death. These two ordinances are: Baptism and The Lord’s Supper. The Lord’s Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

III. HOW DO I PREPARE MYSELF

IV. WHEN AND HOW OFTEN SHOULD WE OBSERVE THE LORD'S SUPPER?

The Bible doesn't say. The Bible doesn't give a rule about how often. Anytime you hear a rule like, "You ought to take the Lord's Supper every Sunday" it's a man-made rule. It's not in the Bible. Or, "You ought to take it once a month". It's a man-made rule. It's not in the Bible. Jesus never said when or how often believers should observe the Lord's Supper. He instituted it on a Thursday night. In Acts 2 they took it in their homes.

WHAT IT MEANS TO BE A MEMBER

The difference between “*attenders*” and “*members*” can be summed up in one word:

Membership swims against the current of America's "consumer religion." **It is an unselfish decision.** Commitment always builds character.

III. A _____ REASON: IT DEFINES WHO CAN BE COUNTED ON

Every team must have a roster. Every school must have an enrollment. Every business has a payroll. Every army has an enlistment. Even our country takes a census and requires voter registration. Membership identifies our family.

IV. A _____ REASON: IT PRODUCES SPIRITUAL GROWTH

The New Testament places a major emphasis on the need for Christians to be accountable to each other for spiritual growth. You cannot be accountable when you're not committed to any specific church family.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF ME AS A MEMBER?

At WEST DIGHTON CHRISTIAN CHURCH we never ask our members to do more than the Bible clearly teaches anyway. We only expect our members to do what the Bible expects every Christian to do

1. I will protect the unity of my church by acting in love toward the other members, refusing to gossip and accepting people as they are

2. I will share the responsibility of my church by praying for its growth, by inviting the unchurched to attend, by warmly welcoming those who visit. The difference between being an attender and member is like being on a cruise. If you're an attender you're just along for the ride. If you're a member you're actually a crew member on the cruise. Now that you join the church it's your job to reach out and bring others in.

3. I will endeavor to grow by:

Supporting the testimony of my church by attending faithfully, by living a godly life, and by giving regularly.

I will take part in a small group/Sunday school/bible study on a regular basis that I may know and love people and so that they can know and love me. I will serve the ministry of my church by discovering my gifts and talents, by being equipped to serve and by developing a servant's heart.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

There are five requirements for membership here at WEST DIGHTON CHRISTIAN CHURCH. You must fulfill all five before you can be a member of this church.

1. Trust Jesus for your salvation.
2. Be baptized by immersion (under water) after you committed your life to Christ?
